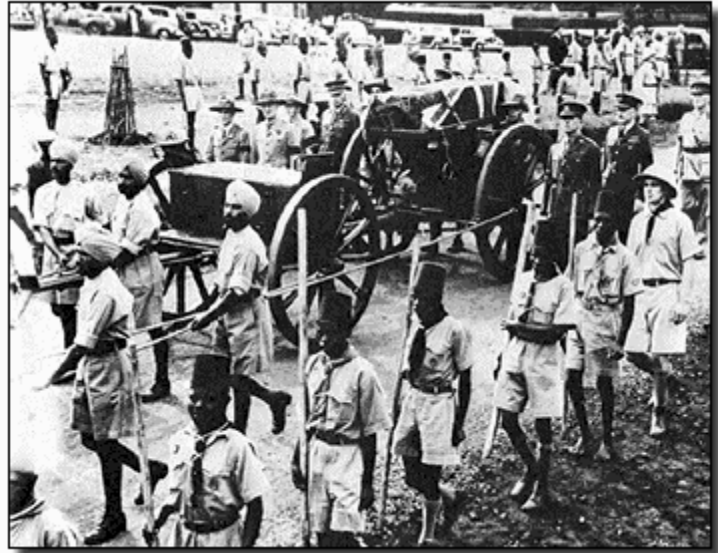


Scouting timeline

- 1941 Death of Baden-Powell, at his home in Nyeri, Kenya. His final message is published to all Scouts
- Lord Baden-Powell is succeeded by Lord Somers
- Air Scouts formed

- 1942 The first National Air Scout Camp takes place
- Senior Scout Section officially started. Scouts is now for 11-15 years and Senior Scouts for 15-18 years
- 1949 First Bob-a-job Week (later known as Scout Job Week) – UK Scouts did jobs to help their local community, raising money for Headquarters and their local Scout Group
- 1953 Scouts on duty at coronation of HM Queen Elizabeth II
- 1957 Centenary of Baden-Powell's birth; Scouting's Golden Jubilee. World Scout Jamboree takes place in Sutton Coldfield, Birmingham
- 1958 First Jamboree-on-the-Air (JOTA), which still happens every year in October
- 1961 Baden-Powell House opened in by HM The Queen.



Bob-a-job-Week

- 1966 The Advance Party Report published, resulting in changes to the Scout programme, uniform and organisational structures
