

Come on a Dinner Crawl on 25th June



If you have never been on one, you may be forgiven for asking the question, "What's a Dinner Crawl?"

A Dinner Crawl is a way of taking an evening meal in company with others during which each course is taken at a different house, ending up at the end of the evening with all gathered together for coffee and conversation before the homeward journey!

In its original concept, it was a way in which members of the congregation could meet others, especially involving newer members mixing with more established members of the congregation, and so including them in a pleasant evening together. It is a good way of being introduced to a fresh group of people.

Four courses are prepared and 20 people eat. They start the meal at different times so that there is only about 5 or 6 people at once in any of the stages before the final course. There is a Starter Course, a Main Course, a Dessert Course and then Coffee and a relaxing end to the evening.

There are lots of good reasons for going on a Crawl!

- You meet other people and visit their homes.
- You eat well and you pay a price which raises money for our church.
- The hosts claim back the cost of their course, so nobody is out of pocket.
- The whole event stimulates friendship and everyone benefits.
